

Making Your Own Dream Quilt (Short-story version)

Supplies:


- Printable fabric “paper” for your ink jet or dot matrix printer. June Taylor and several others are available. I tried the ones by June Taylor. You will need 12 sheets to make the entire quilt.
- Fabric pens. These are made by several companies and some are two size tip ends. They come singles and in sets/packs. Some are wet-er than others so practice before you attempt to color your blocks.

Instructions:


- 1) Insert the fabric into the paper cartridge of your printer. Down load the PDF from the website and save to your hard drive or disk.
- 2) Print the blocks. I printed one at a time in case the fabric jammed.
- 3) Being careful of your work surface, color in the blocks. You can follow my color choices in the book or feel free to make it yours. The ink can be very wet so you may need some paper towels to blot up the excess.
- 4) Remove the backing paper from the fabric. This can be tricky so take your time.
- 5) Trim around each block leaving $\frac{1}{4}$ ” seam allowance.
- 6) At this point you’re ready to continue with the instructions in the book for adding block borders, sashing and quilt borders. The down loaded blocks are 8” finish and the blocks in the book are 9” finish. Therefore your quilt will be slightly smaller.
- 7) Best of making your dream into a reality; send me an email if you get stuck. I’ll be delighted to provide some guidance.




Fabric Road




Corn and Beans




Crazy Log Cabin












