Quilters shared patterns like recipes; they hand penned letters to family and friends in far away places and sent emergency telegrams. They were busy and it's no wonder that some of their quilts never got finished... they were left as orphans for another generation.

Can a vintage collection of unfinished quilts save these memories by having them machine quilted? Is it possible to add a style of simple lines, contemporary fabric and unexpected color blending without compromising the original intent?

The quilts finished are functional as they were conceived. Plausible stories in the form of letters and vintage family photographs shared by friends were added to illustrate a quilted legacy for the next generation.
