

## Feathered Star – Full Day Workshop

**Description:** How about those CURVES? Or should I say, those perfectly pieced curves! After this technique workshop you will never fear them again; we're going to take it one step at a time. Once that is mastered, we're onto the wonderful pieced border. It's your choice to make a wall hanging or go for the full quilt.

### Fabric Requirements (4-blocks):

Blocks: 10 assorted fat quarters (22" x 18") and 1 yard for background

Surprise border: 2 fabrics: ½ yard and ¼ yard

**Special tools:** Easy Companion Angle by Simplicity AND 15" Omni square (bring it if you have one)

**Instruction:** Book - Quilts - Unfinished Stories with New Endings (\$15)

### General supplies:

Sewing machine with manual (are machines provided?); ¼" foot without edge guide (if possible); (2) thread colors, one for the top and another in the bobbin and that is visible on the wrong side of fabric; seam ripper; paper scissors; extra fine sharpie or ink pen; thread snips; rotary cutter, ruler and mat; extension cord; straight pins; finger pressing tool; and batting to use as a design wall (optional).

**Gyleen's thoughts:** Solids and small scale prints really keep the swirls crisp and the points pointy. I would probably avoid directional prints and strips for the swirls. However, directional and stripes would be great for the points. The background is "unpieced" so anything goes.
